Commissioner Welvaert reported that they didn't have food trucks and ran into a beverage problem. She also thanked anyone who aided in the production of the event. She asked the Commission for feedback on the event. Commissioner Lesueur loved the event and was very impressed with the many things available. He noted that he would love it if the tents were closer. Commissioner Ghatti was very impressed with the event and shared how much she enjoyed the event. Chair Carlson shared her appreciation for those involved and thanked those for continuing to put on the event despite weather complications. Commissioner Welvaert shared how thankful she was to the Carver County Library and their participation in the event. She reported that so far, the subcommittee has spent \$1988.45 on the event and received \$750 in donations. The net expenses are \$1,238. Around \$750 will be going back into the Commission's budget.
